
Hint - Use these reference cards as a stepping stone to automatic recall of the Roman numerals.



How to Play

You will need:

- Print the board and laminate it.
- Print and laminate the reference cards.
- One die (yes die is the singular, dice is the plural)
- Small coloured counters for each player e.g. Player 1 = red & Player 2 = green.

How to Play:

1. Roll the die.
2. Choose a square with the same number as the dice.
3. Read the Roman numeral, and if correct, place a coloured counter on the square.
4. The winner is the player who achieves 4 counters in a row vertically, horizontally or diagonally.

Tips and Hints

- This game works best as a two player game.
- Can be played without a die- children just choose numeral.
- Try playing best of three plays – this helps to reinforce roman numerals.
